## CAMPUSES START BY BELIEVING

Many students on college and university campuses experience the trauma of sexual assault or dating violence without ever speaking a word about it to anyone. They may not know where to turn, who will believe them, or how to get help.

When victims have the courage to tell someone about their abuse – whether it is a roommate, friend, resident advisor, or even a professor or administrator – if their disclosure is immediately challenged with doubt or blame for their own actions, the survivor may shut down before fairly considering their reporting options. Or they may recant their report. This offers the campus no opportunity to properly respond and investigate, allowing offenders to continue their abuse.

When we Start by Believing, we create an atmosphere where victims receive the support they need to report their abuse and participate in an investigation. This increases the likelihood of a thorough inquiry and appropriate determination. It is the right thing to do for victims, and best for our campus communities.

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My name is Emma. As a member of the Office of Equity at Utah State University, I recognize the significance in believing survivors of sexual assault without attempting to attribute blame and further victimize them. When someone tells me they were sexually assaulted or abused, I Start by Believing.

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## CAMPUSES TAKE THE LEAD

**Write an article for the campus newspaper.** Many campuses spotlight the issue of sexual assault while they are in the “Red Zone,” the period of time spanning the start of fall semester through Thanksgiving break, when the incidence of sexual assault spikes on college campuses.

**Send a campus wide email.** At Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU), nearly 50,000 students learned about Start by Believing through a personal email sent by University President Dr. Michael Rao.

**Challenge others to join your campaign.** If your campus participates in a local Sexual Assault Response Team (SART) or a Coordinated Community Response (CCR) Team, this is a great place to start. Otherwise, you can contact criminal justice partners and other community agencies to extend your reach.

## Iowa State University & Story County SART members



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Display posters, fliers, banners, and signs where survivors and other students will see them, such as residence and dining halls, recreational and sports facilities, classrooms, administrative offices, the Student Union, and the library. You can also create yard signs to place around campus. Target different populations across the campus community, for an inclusive campaign that benefits all survivors.

Set up a pledge station where students, faculty, and staff can learn about the campaign, and make a personal pledge. Then create a pledge wall to showcase their commitments to Start by Believing.
